MARY II. ARCHITECTUAL RECORDS

A. General Statement

- 1. Anchitectural character: This is a large frame house built in the 1840's. It is an example of the conservative handling of the Greak Revival in Providence with an Ionia entrance peach, corner pilasters, and characteristic interior trim.
- 2. Condition of Sabria: Good

B. Technical Beneription of Exterior

- 1. Orwell dispendency Main block facing south, 46' (five-bay front) x 40', but end-s-helf stories; rear wing 21' wide x 32' deep, was stories.
- 2. Foundations: Flabl stone on inside, large out blocks of stone on outside.
- 3. While constructions (Combounds. Paneled pillsters at the derivers, continued around the corners aboving two faces, maked Sorie conttain with curved surfaces on the lower soldings. Beef cornice is part of a full entablishme with architecture and friend carried corose pilesters.
- 4. Perches: One-story entrance porch with fluted lonic columns at the front corners, full entablature. Back porch on west side of year wing.
- 5. Chimneyer Four brief chimneys in outside walls of main block.

6. Openings;

- a. Boose and degreetys: Large paralled main door in entrance parch, decreay set back of deep pilaster responds of the purch columns. Degreey on cast side opens to stair hall to second floor, added 1952.
- b. Windows and shutters: Six over six light double hung windows, single weed frames with slightly projecting molded lintels. He shutters.

7. Roof:

- a. Shape) Low pitched hip reaf with large, low, lighted manitor.
- b. Germion: Full entablature with deeply projecting, malded cornice, and denticulated bed mold.

C. Technical Description of Interior

1. Floor plane: Central Hell plan. First floor: ceilings 11'-6" high, central hell 10' wide, large living room on morthwest 16' x 28', parler on southwest 16' x 18', bedroom on northwest (criginally a fining room or parler connected by double decre to continuest parler) 16' x 18', original small bedroom at northwest corner of main block new entrance hall for side entrance, kitchen and service rooms in rear wing. Second floor: ceilings 10'-5" high, in main block originally four bedrooms each about 17'

aguare plus a small room 10' x 11' at the south and of the scatteril hall shows the entrance, now used for two spartments with the small room divided into two intellects; small three-ween spartment in rear wing on second floor. One room, used for storage, on third floor lighted by high windows in the mention.

- 2. Stairways: Main stair in central hell, straight run, open string, open well, melded handrall, turned namel and belusters typical of Providence Greek Marival, man step and examinate. Alde stair, remodeled to serve bound Clear sportnesses.
- 3. Phenring: Enter handwood, patterned flooring.
 - 4. Well and ceiling finish: Master, painted or papered.
 - 5. Dente and destroyer Mix penal decre. Flat sunk panals, flattened ages Grank Revival maldings, destroye have panaled Devic pilapters and establishmes with cornices.
 - 6. Trim: Windows have planter trim and cornices to match decourse. Familial Solding interior shutters, paneled under-window egrans. Planter cornices, malded on second floor, with denticulation and other decorative bands on first floor.
 - 7. Reduce: Aliver plated, brees bardware.
 - 8. Lighting: Electric
- Reeting, firephones Control with redictors. Four black mattle mentals, one story either with pilesters or moddings, mental shelf in parlor supported on brockets.
 - D. Site: Elevated high above midewalk, entrance parch twenty steps there sidewalk, lot alopes from east down to west. Necrow lot, gaples on west and in back on morth.
