69 MARSHALL STREET

Built by William Johnson c. 1854

- 1846 On June 19 Arba B. Dike sells to William Johnson lot No. 116 on a plat of the Almy Estate recorded in Plat Book 2 Page 13 and on Plat Card 56 (Deed Book 103.217).
- 1847 On June 18 Ebenezer Kelly sells to William Johnson for \$275 lot 150 on a plat of land belonging to J. P. Rhodes recorded in Plat Book 2 Page 13 (DB 107.168).
- 1848 On June 22 Ebenezer Kelly sells to William Johnson for \$540 lots 117 and 149 (now 69 Marshall) on a plat formerly belonging to J. P. Rhodes (DB 112.76)
- (Lots 116 and 117 on Almy Street back up to lots 150 and 149 on Marshall Street.)
- 1850 According to Providence Directory Johnson lived at 9 Almy (lot 116) and operated a jewelry business at 10 Marshall (lot 150). John Hutchins Cady's Providence Street Directory indicates that in 1850 #9 is the highest number on Almy Street and #10 the highest on Marshall. Therefore we may assume that lot 149 does not contain a building at this time.
- 1854 Tax Ledger A4.25 shows a building valued at \$700 on this land. (The early lot numbers have been changed and lot 149 is now 126).
- 1857 H. F. Walling map shows a building on this lot.
