- 1785 WILL: James Angell...Property was divided into four parcels to be equally divided among his six children...Wills 6.458-459-460
- 1786 Moses Brown and Nathan Waterman, executors u/w James Angell, divide and set off to his daughter Abigail a certain lot of land called the corner lot Bounded: S on a 30' highway 101 $\frac{1}{2}$ '; W on the Main Street 35' beginning 4' from the S/W corner of the tailor's shop; E by Edward and Benjamin Taylor 40'..said lot to include all buildings(belonging to her said Father in his lifetime) standing thereon and is her full proportion of the divisible part of her Father's Estate... Deed Book 22.40
- 1786 INDENTURE: William Goddard releases all claims to the Angell Estate to his wife Abigail (Angell) Goddard...DB 22.74  
WILL:
- 1846 Abigail Goddard devises all her property to daughters Mary, Abby and Sarah and son William Goddard...Wills W15.291
- 1854 Property taxed to William Goddard heirs and until
- 1921 Hope G Iselin et al sell to Stuart C Cruickshank a certain parcel of land with a Dwelling House bounded: Beginning 42' E of North Main St and running N 63' bounded W by Preston Arnold; N by the NY, NH and Hartford R R 44.16'; E by Sidney Burleigh 75'; S by Thomas Street 38.58'...DB 610.244  
Property owned by the Curickshanks until
- 1960 Providence Water Color Club owns the property

Miss Mary G Goddard lived on Thomas Street in 1857 at #6
