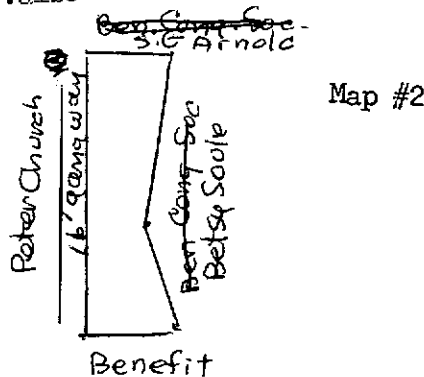
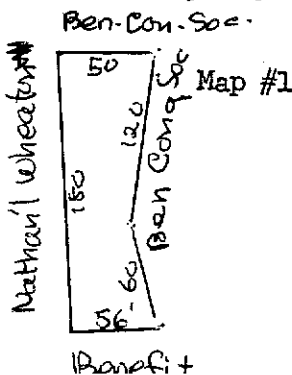

- 1783 Darius Sessions et al, the committee appointed by the Benevolent Congregational Society, sell for 400 Spanish milled dollars to Josiah Draper, yeoman a certain lot of land near King's Chapel on the E side of Benefit Street bounded: N by Nathaniel Wheaton 180'; E by the grantor 50'; S 120' and 60' by grantor; W by Benefit Street 56'...Deed Book 19.424 ..see Map #1
- 1792 Josiah Draper of Attleborough, sells to Abner Daggett, imholder, for 450 L "a certain lot of land heretofor belonging to the Benevolent Congregational Society and bought by him in 1783 " together with all buildings and DWELLING HOUSE with gangway and well privileges as per agreement between said Josiah Draper and Nathaniel Wheaton in 1786 (19.530)...DB 23.91

- 1842 Ann Daggett et al heirs-at-law of Abner Daggett, sell for \$3600 to George Owen the above property at #51 Benefit Street (see Map #2)..DB 84.51
- 1844 George Owen, jeweler lived here..in rear: Henry Congdon, Lydia Owen, widow, and Smith Owen, jeweler...Providence Directory
- 1847 George Owen, jeweler and Jonas Hartwell lived here...in Rear; Lydia and Smith Owen and Henry R Congdon, boot and shoe merchant...Prov Dir
- 1866 Ezekiel Owen, jeweller, and William B Weeden, wool manufacturer...in rear: Benjamin Howard and Adah Owen...Prov Directory
- Property was in the Owen family until

- + 1798 CHACE NOTES: Abner Daggett: W on Benefit; N on gangway; DH 38' x 28'...wood 2 stories. Lot 48' x 180' ending in rear only 40'. Wood House 18' x 14'.. wood. Barn 26' 24'.

1814 DIRECT TAX: Abner Daggett.. E side Benefit Street..48' x 180' with a Dwelling House 28' x 38'..2 stories high...also
