1822	School teacher in Gloucester, Rhode Island
1823	Closes school in Gloucester, moves to Providence, gains employment with Low, Hunt & Co., merchants
1829	Employed as clerk, Roger Williams Bank
1835	Employed at Phenix Bank

For many years a deacon at Beneficent Congregational Church.

George E. Martin was also a clerk at the Phenix Bank at the time he served as trustee of White's estate; the 1892 directory, further, shows his address as 118 Bowen Street (this house before the street was renumbered in its current fashion?)
