

The two story central chimney gable roofed house that stands side to the street at the steep sidewalk's edge at 11 Cady Street was probably built in about 1807, although the first mention of it appears in an estate division of 1833. In 1807 John Mawney sold the lot this house stands on to Sylvanus Martin. In a document concerning the estate dated in 1833, Martin's house and lot on the north side of Cady Street was valued at \$1700. The family owned it until 1864 when it was sold at auction to George Richmond. Charles O'Reilly bought it in 1882 and it remained in his family until 1944. In that year Dr. and Mrs. Alex Burgess bought the house and restored it as part of an earlier effort to start a said gram of improving the condition of the houses in the area. has been owned by Mr. and Mrs. Waldo Kaufer since 1950.

The building has fortunately survived almost without change, and its five room ground plan, steep three run stairway, the man-

tels, cornices, and chair rail detail are all intact and are part of the original trim of the house. The districted door on the downhill (west end) side of the douse was installed in 1944 and a small apartment was made on the ground story at this time. It opens onto a terraced garden. The entry to the main house is now placed on the east or uphil cable end, but there is evidence that originally a double flight of stairs on the Cady Street side led up to a central doorway set above the high basement, as may still be seen in other hillside dwellings here and there. The main intering staircase still keeps its place in what was originally the front hall.

Kaufer's studio is on display and in the house is a collection paintings and prints by Rhode Island artists as well as s own meticulously delineated and fascinating work.

- In the book of maps entitled "Owners and Occupants of the Lots, Houses and Shops in the Town of Providence in 1798", compiled in 1914 by Henry R. Chace, the name "N. Packard" is printed where 11 Cady Street is located. In addition, the index shows the letter "H" for "house" at this location.
- Division of the estate of Sylvanus Martin. "The dwelling house and lot on the north side of Cady's Lane, with one half of the gangway 22 feet wide to the left open for the mutual accomodation of said lot and of the lot on the south side of said gangway. The north line of which gangway shall be in the range of the southerly side of said dwelling house together with a privilege..." "Valuation... \$1700" Deed Book 63 Page 257 February 7, 1834
- William M. Martin et al, heirs of Sylvanus Martin, issue quit claim deed to Abby Martin "all personal and real estate"

- James Humphrey, by default of mortgage to Abby Martin, for \$3050, sell to George M. Richmond, the highest bidder at auction, "a certain lot of land with dwelling house bounded northerly by Thomas Meriweather, 60 feet, easterly by Asa Newell, southerly by Cady Street, 60 feet, and westerly by land formerly of Samuel Wales."



Assessment

Previous research concerning 11 Cady Street concluded that the house was constructed circa 1808. This date was ascribed to the house on the basis of Deed 41/57. Further research indicates that this deed was incorrectly identified as being relevant to the history of the house. Firstly, the date 1807 was quoted as being that when the deed was recorded. A rechecking of Deed 41/57 showed that the date was 18 August 1817, ten years later. On this basis, the construction date of circa 1808 is invalid. Furthermore, the deed itself is not a deed for the house at 11 Cady Street. It appears to be the deed for a lot one block south and closer to Main Street. One explanation for this is that John Mawney is incorrectly identified as the owner of the 11 Cady Street property on the Henry R. Chace map of Providence of 1798. The correct property owner is Nathaniel Packard. Judging from the style of the house, which is late Georgian/early Federal, and the newly discovered map and deed information, an accurate date for the house would be circa 1790.
