- 1808 WILL: Wait Smith devises all her Estate to her daughter Martha Howell wife of Jeremiah Brown Howell...Wills 13.13
- 1845 Martha Howell, for the natural love and affection towards her daughter Martha Brown Lippitt, wife of Charles, gives to her all right, title, and interest "I now have to a lot of land bounded W by Benefit Street 157'; N by the Benevolent Congregational Meeting House Lot 197 $\frac{1}{2}$ '; E by Sarah B Wilcox; S by Charles Field Street 123'...and is the same lot my respected Mother, Mrs Waite Smith intended for my said daughter Martha B Lippitt"...Deed Bk 95.239
- * 1852 Charles Lippitt at #5 Charles Field for 1st time - Prov. Div.

- 1889 WILL: Martha B Lippitt: "After the demise of her two said daughters and the children of either one shall reach 21 years of age, they ~~sh~~ shall share and share alike when the trust shall terminate...being Frank L Glezer, son of Martha L Glezer and Isabelle A Grapel, daughter of Sarah H Arnold." Wills 23.59
- 1889 William D Nisbit, trustee of Martha B Lippitt Estate gives to Frank L Glezer and Isabelle A Grapel, share and share alike a certain tract of land with all buildings and improvements on the N/ly side of Charles Field Street, bounded: S/ly on Charles Field Street; W/ly by Charles Simms and Louisa Manton; N/ly by the Congregational Society and Hiram Thomas; E/ly by a gangway and Abby Fisher...DB 352.185
- 1947 Rhode Island Trust Company, trustee u/w Anna^D Glezer, sells to Clarence H Gifford jr a certain lot of land with all buildings and improvements on the N side of Charles Field Street bounded: S by Charles Field Street 72.38' and 52.55' E from the corner of Charles Field and Benefit Street; W by Drabble, Manton, and Chandler 142.71'; N by the First Congregational Church; E 52.55', N 8', E 100', the last three courses by Elizabeth and Madeline Brown. The said premises comprise the same conveyed u/w Martha B Lippitt to Frank L Glezer and Isabelle A Grapel in 1889. (352.88) DB 917.83

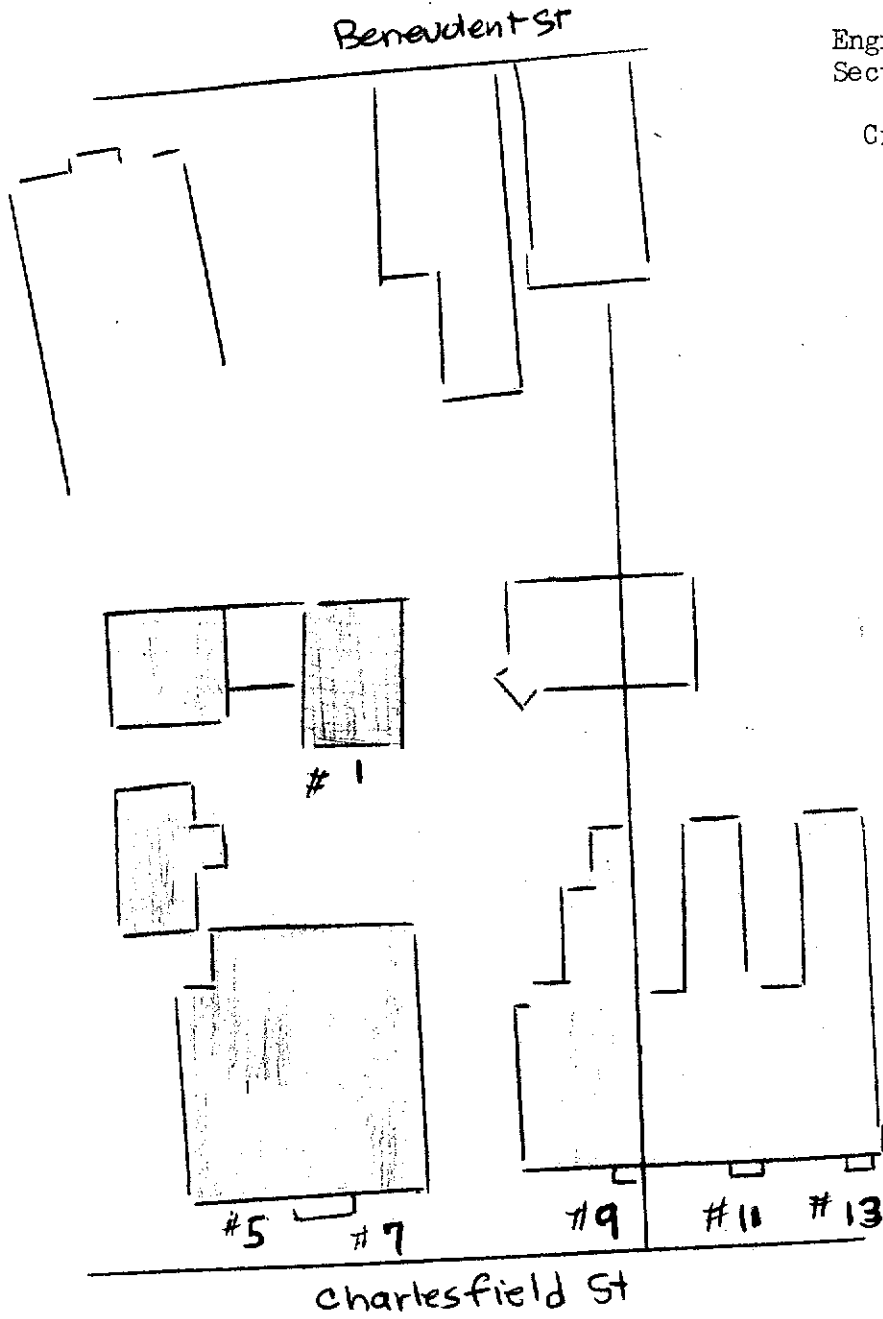

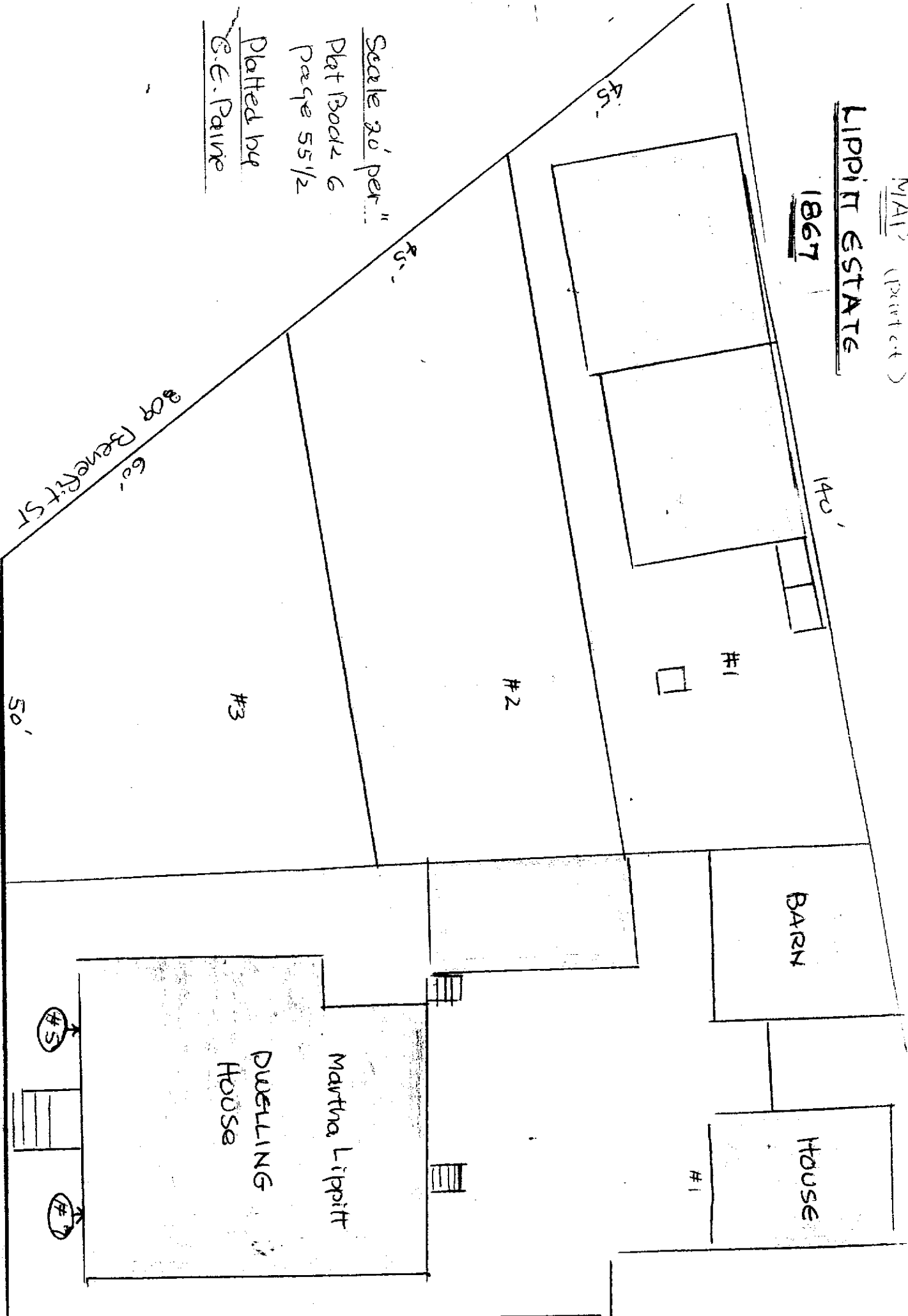

- 1808 WILL: Wait Smith: Devises all her estate to her daughter Martha Brown Howell... Wills 13.13
- 1837 GANGWAY: Agreement: Between Sally B Wilcox wife of Horace A Wilcox and Martha B Lippitt wife of Charles, adjoining owners on Charles Field Street between Benefit and Brown Streets. For the purpose of making a gangway between the two said Estates for the mutual benefit of both. "We agree, each of us to lay out 10' front and rear for this purpose and 100' in from Charles Field Street." Deed Book 137.280
- 1845 Martha Howell quit claims to daughter Sally B Wilcox a certain lot of land bounded: S by Charles Field Street 80'; E by Martha Walker 170'; N by Solomon Townsend et al 117'; W by Martha B Lippitt... DB 97.129
- 1845 INDENTURE: Horace A and Sally B Wilcox vs William R Watson: H A and ~~S B~~ Wilcox farm let to William R Watson a lot of land on the N side of Charles Field Street bounded: S by Charles Field Street 80'; W by a gangway and Marth B Lippitt 100'; N by H and S Watson 80'; E 100'...for a period of 15 years. In case of default of payment Horace A and Sally B Wilcox have the liberty to purchase the buildings and improvements which shall then have been erected and thereby terminate the lease. To erect a fence on the W side of premises and said W R Watson will erect on said premises by March 1847 a house or houses to be pledged for payment or forfeit all claims. The use of the gangway on the W is included...DB 98.185-88
- 1847 - *Moses Lockwood at #9 Allen Brown at #11 - Prov. Dir.*
- 1850 William R Watson sells for \$10,000 to City Bank Corporation the above instrument of lease for the remainder of the term and sells also all buildings and improvements (Mtg to Richmond Bullock)... DB 120.82
- 1852 City Bank Corporation, for \$6000 transfers to Sally B Wilcox, wife of Horace A Wilcox a certain lot of land on the N/ly side of Charles Field Street, being the same Lot of land described in a lease from S B and H A Wilcox to William R Watson in 1845. Also all our right title and interest in and to the block containing 3 wooden Dwelling Houses and to other buildings and improvements on said Lot of Leased Land. The premises aforesaid being same conveyed to us by William R Watson in 1850. Subject to mortgage by W R Watson to R Bullock in 1846 (4.95) Personal Property...DB 128.196
- 1853 POLICY RECORD: Henry B Drown, trustee for Horace A & Sally B Wilcox Charles Field Street: Wood...75' x 37' with three additions of 24' x 14' each...all 2 stories high in front and rear..occupied for a DWELLING HOUSE. On leased land and under mortgage to Julia Bullock.53.23006

1856 INDENTURE: Sally B Wilcox farm lets to ~~Bye~~ Rufus Buell the Middle and East Houses #11 and #13 in the Block of 3 houses on the N side of Charles Field Street with yards, for 2 years and seven months to be used as a DWELLING HOUSE and School House and apartments for a high school for Young Ladies only, and for no other purpose, at an annual rent of \$1075. Lessee to repair the E tenement #13 as soon as possible, paint and whitewash interiors supply blinds in back ell, shall put rantes in this tenement and other ~~if needed~~, shall make 2 doors thru from one tenement to another, one on the 1st story and one in the garrett, shall carry water from front eaves trough across E end of house into cistern by a pipe, shall put register in front parlor of #11, shall make a gateway between the back yard of the two houses, shall put a cinque and pump in 2nd story of ell #13 similar to the one in #11; raise top of chimney in ell part of #13 or cap to prevent smoking; shall build a dormer window in attic of #13, repair floor cellar of #13 and water closet in backyard of #13 in proper order so that rain water shall run into waste water cistern and put eaves of #13 in good condition and a dumb waiter in #13 at their own expense. Take good care of the premises and at own expense make all repairs...DB 128.376
