Said lots are known as Lots Number 15 and 26 on a Plat of Lots on Prospect Hill which said Plat is recorded in ... Book No. 39 page 411. Said lots are bounded and described as follows viz: North by Cushing Street on which they measure 50 feet each ... Easterly by Lot No. 14 on said Plat on which they measure  $97\frac{1}{4}$  feet more or less Southerly 100 10/12 feet more or less on land belonging to heirs of Nicholas Brown and Westerly by Lot No. 17 on said Plat on which it measures 93 feet more or less.
